

## **FSC Press Release – Public Statement re: COVID-19 – March 23, 2020**

Dear FSC Clients, Colleagues, Families, and Friends,

Like many of you, we are closely monitoring developments with regard to the rapidly evolving COVID-19 situation. As always, our priority during this unprecedented time is the safety and well-being of our employees, their families, and our valued clients and friends.

As we eagerly wait to turn the corner on current events, we want to assure everyone that our business continuity plan is in full swing to ensure no drop in the level of excellent service and responsiveness you have come to expect from FSC. As part of our comprehensive efforts to maintain our high professional standards, while at the same time doing our part to promote community health and safety, we have implemented the following measures:

- All FSC personnel have been instructed to work remotely to the greatest extent possible. Over the past several years we have doubled down on our technology investments, moving the majority of our practice areas to the cloud and enhancing the multiple levels of security that were already in place to protect our clients' confidential and proprietary information. These investments allow our attorneys and staff to work from anywhere in the world just as if they are sitting at their desk at one of our multiple office locations. Most of the firm has been working remotely for over a week now, and we are pleased to report no lapse in productivity and zero down time.
